Our Independence is achieved after achieving communal harmony. Gandhiji always gave importance on this and wrote a book called "The way to communal harmony".

During India-Pakistan partition wide range of communal violence took place. In postindependence era also India faced many communal clashes like Gujarat riot and Jhanmabhoomi- Babri Masjid. Communal violence is a biggest threat to internal security; communal polarisation creates an atmosphere of fear, anxiety and uncertainty among people.

What India needs?

The need of the hour is harmony and peace through which we can attain socioeconomic development. Even Kashmir issue can be solved by attaining communal harmony. Cultural harmony and linguistic harmony also has to be maintained for peaceful and prosperous country. Secular character of all the institutions, Judiciary, Executive and Legislature, is a pre-requisite for peace and harmony. The constitution of the country has enforced laws to ensure communal harmony in the country and the government taking all the necessary measures to ensure the same. The people participation especially the youth is essential to achieve this goal.

We the Indians have a very proud legacy of tolerance and respect for other's views and thoughts. So, we the people have to take responsibility of imparting brotherhood and togetherness in society and try to make our country peaceful. Eventually it is the responsibility of the political and religious leadership, civil society, intelligentsia and the media to uphold the Constitution and the integrity of institutions. The communal harmony campaign week (November 25-29) is celebrated every year to promote national integrity and government has erected Sardar Vallabhai Patel -statue of Unity in Gujarat for the same.
