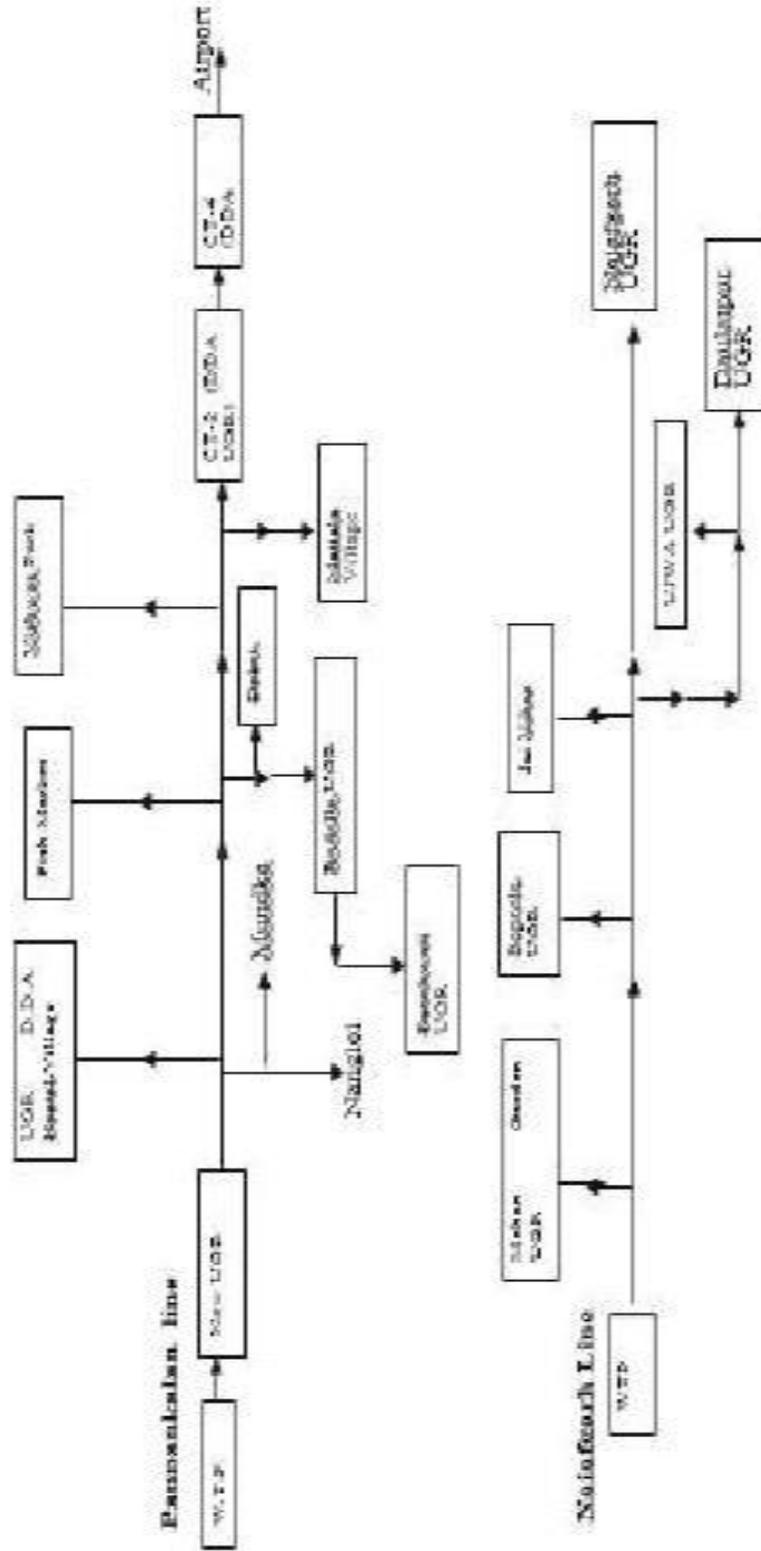

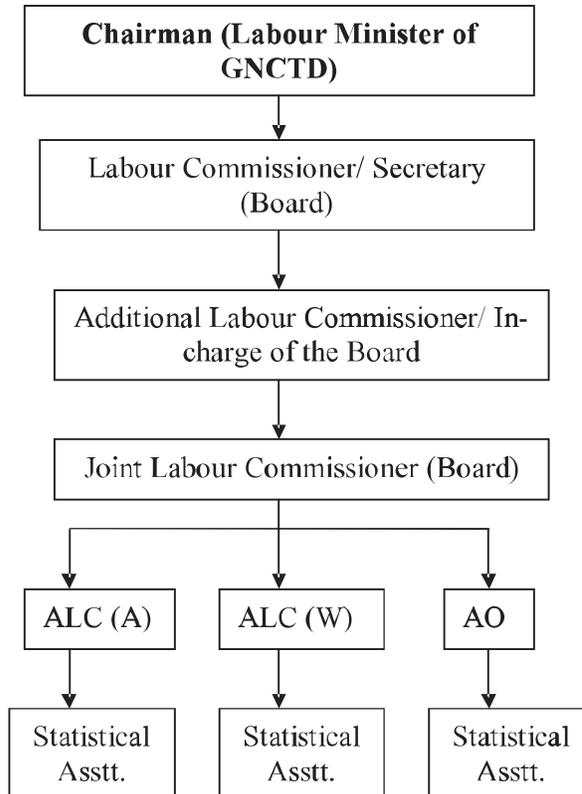

Evaluation of the scheme by consultant
(Referred to in paragraph – 3.3.12)

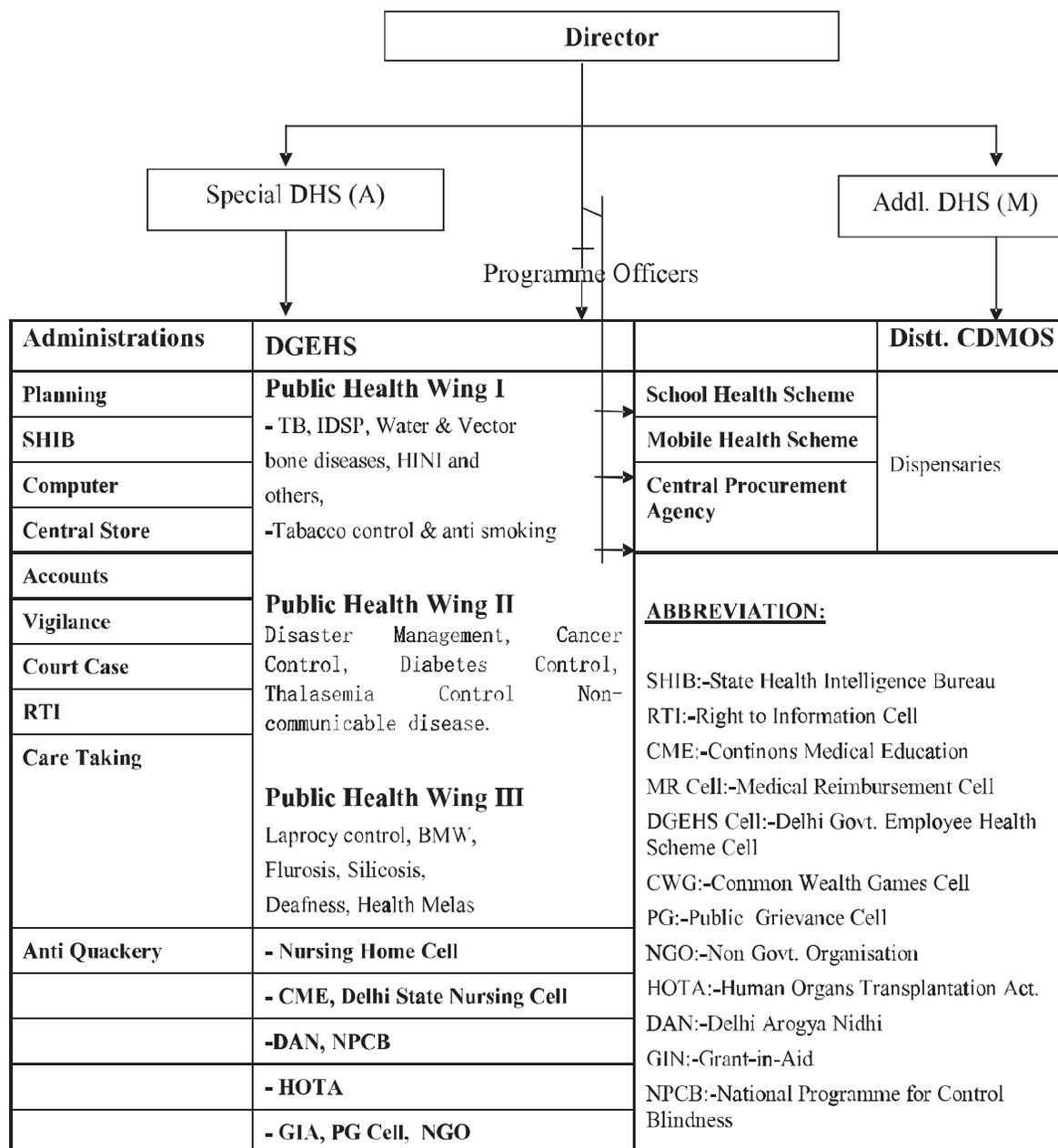
As per the Cabinet decision of February 2008, review of the scheme should be conducted every two years, in order to monitor its progress. However, it was observed that the scheme was evaluated only once during the year 2009, by engaging a consultant on nomination basis. The evaluation report submitted by the consultant, revealed the following shortcomings in the implementation of the scheme:

- (i) 3750 cases of domiciliary birth registered were not verified,
- (ii) verification of beneficiaries of the scheme was not conducted,
- (iii) the impact of the scheme was not assessed,
- (iv) there were ample evidences that more vulnerable population finds it difficult to access the scheme,
- (v) most of the recipients of the scheme were in the Above Poverty Line (APL) segment,
- (vi) girls living in *Jhuggis* were at high risk of missing the Ladli enrolment and were four times less likely to get benefits, as compared to those living in better localities,
- (vii) the families who live in rented houses are almost twice unlikely to get their girls enrolled under the Scheme, and
- (viii) 42 *per cent* of girls did not get benefits of the scheme due to non-renewal of their cases during 2010-11 to 2011-12.
