

# Glossary

## Glossary

<b>Nitrogenous Fertilizer</b>	Fertilizer primarily having nitrogen nutrient.
<b>Phosphatic fertilizers</b>	Fertilizer primarily having phosphorus nutrient.
<b>Potassic fertilizers</b>	Fertilizer primarily having potash nutrient.
<b>Nutrient</b>	Nutrients are the constituents of fertilizers which plants utilize to grow.
<b>Farm gate price</b>	The price (including tax) at which fertilizer is available to the end user i.e. Farmers.
<b>Preferred ratio</b>	The scientifically prescribed ratio of nutrient which ensures soil health and balanced fertilization.
<b>Agricultural Productivity</b>	The ratio of agricultural outputs to agricultural inputs.
<b>Installed capacity</b>	The production that can be obtained by optimal utilization of facilities of the installation.
<b>Complex fertilizer</b>	The fertilizer containing nitrogen, phosphorus and potash nutrient.
<b>Benchmark price</b>	The purchase price considered for fixation of subsidy rates.
<b>Primary Movement</b>	Movement by rail from the plant or the port to various rake points.
<b>Secondary Movement</b>	Movement by road from the nearest rake points to the block headquarters in the district.
<b>Cheaper Domestic/APM gas</b>	The indigenously produced gas which is available to fertilizer companies as per allocation by MoPNG.
<b>Fertilizer Bonds</b>	The bonds issued to fertilizer companies in lieu of cash reimbursement of subsidy.
<b>Mopping up of Subsidy</b>	The recovery of excess amount of subsidy on closing stock of fertilizer when subsidy is reduced.
<b>Open General License</b>	A type of import license issued by the Government to its domestic importer.
<b>Monthly Supply Plan</b>	The plan based on requirement projected by DAC in consultation with State Government. The plan is issued by DoF to fertilizer companies on or before 25 <sup>th</sup> of each preceding month.
