## Proceedings of the Departmental Screening Committee for Compassionate Appointment

A Departmental Screening Committee (DSC)<sup>1</sup> consisting of Shri Pawan Kumar Konda, Sr. DAG (AMG-IV), O/o the Accountant General (Audit-II), Kolkata (Chairperson), Ms Aditi Sharma, Sr. DAG (AMG-I & Admn), O/o the Accountant General (Audit-II), Kolkata and Shri Rupak Saha, Director, O/o the Director General of Audit, South Eastern Railway, Kolkata met on 02.08.2022 at the Chamber of Deputy Director, Administration, O/o the Director General of Audit, Central, Kolkata to consider the applications for compassionate appointment in the Office of the Director General of Audit, Central, Kolkata.

- 2. While considering the cases before it, the Committee referred to the instructions contained in the Department of Personnel and Training O.M. Nos. 14014/02/2012-Estt (D) dated 16.01.2013 and 43019/9/2019-Estt (D) dated 23.08.2021 and Headquarters Office Circular No. 14 dated 20.04.2022.
- 3. The Committee was informed that a total of seven vacancies, as shown in the table below, have been earmarked for compassionate appointment during the panel year 2022.

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- 4. The applications for compassionate appointment received from the dependents of the deceased employees of this Office were put up before the Committee for consideration. The details are summarized briefly in Annexure A.
- 5. The Committee perused the applications, the verification reports of the Welfare Officer as well as other relevant records in respect of the applicants, the details of assets and liabilities of each of the applicants as per Welfare Officer's report and the evaluation sheet of each of the applicants based on Headquarters Office Circular No. 14 dated 20.04.2022.

## 6. Case wise observation of Committee:

The committee observed the following points in respect of each individual case:

- Ms. Babita Banerjee: The Committee took note of the untimely and unfortunate demise of Shri Santanu Banerjee, Ex-AAO as a result of the worldwide Covid-19 Pandemic, thereby leaving the family in a state of distress. It was observed that the deceased had more than ten years of service left at the time of his death. The wife of the deceased has one minor daughter (aged about 14 years) studying in class VII and the family would need financial support for continuation of her studies and setting up her career. Coincidentally, the applicant in the instant case is physically handicapped, too. The applicant is aged about 48 years (D.O.B.: 21.05.1973). There is no job holder in the family. Hence, the Committee is of the opinion that the case is fit for compassionate appointment so as to provide support to the distressed family and compensate the family of the deceased to a certain extent for the untimely loss of life.
- B. Ms. Tanima Das: The Committee took note of the untimely and unfortunate demise of Shri Tarun Das, Ex-MTS as a result of the worldwide Covid-19 Pandemic, thereby leaving the family in a state of distress. It was observed that the deceased had more than two years of service left at the time of his death. His daughter, Ms Tanima Das (aged about 24 years), the applicant for compassionate appointment has just completed her LLB degree. There is no job holder in the family. There is no immovable property in the name of the family of the deceased. The family resides in *thika tenant premises* occupied for shelter by her grandmother. Hence, the Committee is of the opinion that the case is fit for compassionate appointment so as to provide support to the distressed

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- Ms. Prerna Praveen: The Committee took note of the untimely and unfortunate demise of Shri Sanjeev Kumar, Ex-AAO as a result of the worldwide Covid-19 Pandemic, thereby leaving the family in a state of distress. It was observed that The Committee took note of the fact that the deceased had more than nineteen years of service left at the time of his death. The wife of the deceased has one minor daughter (aged 9 years) studying in class III and the family would need financial support for continuation of her studies and setting up her career. There is no job holder in the family. Hence, the Committee is of the opinion that the case is fit for compassionate appointment so as to provide support to the distressed family and compensate the family of the deceased to a certain extent for the untimely loss of life.
- Ms. Moumita Mandal: The Committee took note of the untimely and unfortunate demise of Shri Syamal Kumar Mandal, Ex-Sr.AO, thereby leaving the family in a state of distress. It was observed that the deceased had more than three years of service left at the time of his death. The wife of the deceased has two sons, both still studying. Elder son is pursuing 'Diploma in Tourism Studies' and currently stays in Delhi for better career opportunities and younger son is studying in Class XI. Thus, both the children are at a crucial stage of their careers and the family would need financial support for continuation of their studies. There is no job holder in the family. Hence, the Committee is of the opinion that the case is fit for compassionate appointment so as to provide support to the distressed family and compensate the family of the deceased to a certain extent for the untimely loss of life.
- 7. The Committee also took note of the points awarded to each applicant on the basis of the point-based evaluation system prescribed by Headquarters Office Circular No. 14 dated 20.04.2022 which is as below:

- A. Ms. Babita Banerjee is a Graduate (Bachelor of Arts) and since vacancy is available in the cadre of Auditor, the DSC recommends that Ms. Banerjee may be considered for appointment to the post of Auditor in the Office of the Director General of Audit (Central), Kolkata.
- B. Ms. Tanima Das is an LLB and since vacancy is available in the cadre of Auditor, the DSC recommends that Ms. Das may be considered for appointment to the post of Auditor in the Office of the Director General of Audit (Central), Kolkata.
- C. Ms. Prerna Praveen is an MBA and since vacancy is available in the cadre of Auditor, the DSC recommends that Ms. Praveen may be considered for appointment to the post of Auditor in the Office of the Director General of Audit (Central), Kolkata:
- D. Ms. Moumita Mandal is a Graduate (Bachelor of Arts) and since vacancy is available in the cadre of Auditor, the DSC recommends that Ms. Mandal may be considered for appointment to the post of Auditor in the Office of the Director General of Audit (Central), Kolkata.

The Committee hereby certifies that none of their close relatives is being considered by the Departmental Screening Committee constituted for the purpose of considering the applications for appointment under compassionate grounds in the Office of the Director General of Audit, Central, Kolkata and that otherwise also they are not interested in any particular candidate.
