

INTRODUCTION

Moradabad Division is one of the five Railway Divisions under Northern Railway Zone (NR) of Indian Railways. The Division, with a route kilometerage of approximately 2701 Track Kms (BG) and 150 block stations, 5 block huts, 49 halts and 3 flag stations caters to the Rail Transport needs of Parts of Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.

Moradabad Division serves a large number of industrial and important towns like Moradabad, Bareilly, Shahjahanpur, Rosa, Hapur, Hardoi and Chandausi in Uttar Pradesh and Dehradun, Haridwar and Roorkee in Uttarakhand. Moradabad is also an important Division for freight traffic the main commodities loaded been food grains, Petroleum Products, Cotton, Machinery and Components. Inward traffic comprises Iron and Steel, Fertilizer, Coal, Petroleum Products and Cement.
