The Calcutta High Court, the oldest High Court in India, was established on 1 July 1862. Formerly known as the High Court of Judicature at Fort William, it exercises jurisdiction over the State of West Bengal and the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The High Court building, constructed in 1872, is a notable example of neo-Gothic architecture designed by Walter Granville, inspired by the Cloth Hall, Ypres in Belgium.

During this quarter, the Institute successfully organized the All India Workshop on Data-led Audit, a GIS Training Programme for the North-Eastern Region, the FLY PRO Training Programme, the All India Training Programme on the Transport Sector, the All India Training Programme on Auditing through GIS, and Orientation Training for Supervisors and AAOs, along with various General and IT training programmes.

REGIONAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

The Annual Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) Meeting was convened on 9th February 2026 at the Regional Capacity Building and Knowledge Institute (RCB&KI), Kolkata, to deliberate on key training and capacity-building priorities. The meeting was chaired by Ms. Keerti Tewari, Deputy Comptroller and Auditor General (Eastern Region).

The Principal Director warmly welcomed the Chairperson and all RAC members and initiated discussions on the agenda items. Key highlights included 98.53% slot utilization in General Training and 100% in IT Training.

During the meeting, discussions were held on the proposed training programmes for 2026-27. A total of 27 General Courses (including 5 All India Training Programmes) and 15 IS courses, have been proposed. The Institute has also introduced a new training programme titled "Transition to Post-Service Life" (for retiring officers and officials).

RAC members provided valuable suggestions on topics to be included in future sessions, emphasizing their relevance and potential impact on capacity building.

The workshop witnessed active participation from senior leadership. The sessions covered a wide range of contemporary topics, including the strategic shift in compliance and transaction auditing, data-led audits of social sector schemes, data-led approaches in remote and hybrid work audits with demonstration of AI/ML applications, application of OCR technology for conversion of complex documents into structured datasets, and data-led establishment audit.

A total of 60 participants from various Eastern Region offices attended the workshop, comprising 12 Group Officers and 48 Senior Audit Officers and Assistant Audit Officers. The sessions were highly interactive and enriched with live case studies, ensuring a practical and impactful learning experience for all participants. The workshop was widely appreciated and considered highly successful.

The Geographic Information System (GIS) is a digital tool for collecting, organising, analysing, and visualising spatial data. It enables users to capture and display geographic information through layered maps and interactive visualisations, helping to identify patterns and support informed decision-making. In public audit, GIS is increasingly used in areas such as social infrastructure, environmental audit, water resources, and land use. Standards such as ISSAI 5540 also emphasise its importance, particularly in audits relating to disaster management and relief operations.

**ALL INDIA TRAINING PROGRAMME ON “TRANSPORT
SECTOR: EMERGING TRENDS, FINANCIAL
MANAGEMENT AND AUDIT PERSPECTIVES**

The Regional Capacity Building and Knowledge Institute organised an All India Training Programme on “Transport Sector: Emerging Trends, Financial Management and Audit Perspectives” from 23-25 February 2026 in collaboration with the Eastern India Regional Council (EIRC) of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI). The programme witnessed participation from officers across the country.

The training programme covered a wide range of contemporary topics related to the transport sector, including the structure and financing of transport infrastructure, Public-Private Partnerships (PPP) in transport with a focus on financial features and audit sensitivities, infrastructure project financing, and accounting and reporting practices in transport Public Sector Undertakings. Sessions also addressed valuation methods used in transport projects, internal controls and risk areas, disclosure and compliance requirements, and the application of data analytics and technology tools in audit. Professional ethics and oversight in infrastructure audit were also discussed.

The sessions were conducted by Chartered Accountants from ICAI-EIRC, bringing valuable industry insights, while departmental faculty members contributed through audit case studies and demonstrations on the use of IT tools in

audit. The programme also included case-based discussions, enhancing the participants' understanding of real-world audit scenarios.

The programme was well received by the participants and received an overall rating of 9.32 (on a scale of 10), reflecting its effectiveness and relevance.

ORIENTATION TRAINING FOR SUPERVISORS AND ASSISTANT AUDIT OFFICERS

The Regional Capacity Building and Knowledge Institute organised a comprehensive Orientation Training Programme for officers from user offices from 12 February to 26 March 2026. The six-week programme aimed to familiarise participants with the functioning of the Department, including key rules, regulations, audit procedures, and fundamentals of noting and drafting.

The curriculum adopted a balanced approach by integrating technical knowledge with professional development. Sessions covered a wide range of areas such as governance and transparency, delegation of financial powers, constitutional aspects of budgeting, ethical standards within the C&AG's organisation, taxation concepts, Official Language (Hindi), and gender sensitisation. Emphasis was also placed on organisational culture, problem-solving techniques, career progression, and advanced MS Excel skills. A strong focus was laid on practical learning. Participants were provided hands-on exposure to various IT tools and applications used in routine audit work, including MS Word, MS Excel, IDEA, KNIME and Tableau, along with emerging applications of Artificial Intelligence in audit and foundational IT audit methodologies. Equal emphasis was placed on enhancing communication and interpersonal skills to strengthen professional engagement with auditee entities.

The programme drew upon the expertise of a diverse faculty comprising experts from across the country, local resource persons and in-house trainers, contributing to a rich and well-rounded

learning experience. Participants demonstrated their learning through individual and group presentations.

As part of experiential learning, participants visited the Museum of Astronomy and Space Science, Kolkata, where they gained insights into astronomy, space science and related fields. During the visit, scholars and officials of the museum guided them in exploring the exhibits and understanding the technical aspects of these subjects, making the experience engaging and informative. The programme was well received and widely appreciated by the participants.

TRAINING ON DATA ANALYTICS USING KNIME AND TABLEAU

The Regional Capacity Building and Knowledge Institute conducted a training programme on *Data Analytics using KNIME and Tableau* from 12-16 January 2026.

Data analytics—the systematic examination of large datasets to derive meaningful insights, identify trends, and support informed decision-making—has become an essential component of modern auditing. Its application enables auditors to detect anomalies, assess risks, and enhance the accuracy and efficiency of audit processes.

The programme commenced with an inaugural session, followed by an introduction to database fundamentals. Over the five-day programme, participants were exposed to a wide range of topics, including basic concepts of data analytics, different data types, and types of analytics. Practical sessions focused on KNIME, covering workflow creation, node functionalities, ETL operations and statistical analysis. Training on Tableau included data cleaning and preparation, creation of basic and advanced charts, data analysis, and hands-on case studies.

The sessions were delivered by a combination of external experts and internal faculty members, ensuring a balanced mix of theoretical knowledge and practical exposure. The programme was well received, with participants expressing satisfaction with the achievement of the learning objectives. The programme received an overall rating of 9.43 (on a scale of 10), reflecting its effectiveness and relevance.

TRAINING PROGRAMME ON DATABASE CONCEPTS AND SQL

The Regional Capacity Building and Knowledge Institute organised a training programme on Database Concepts and SQL from 16-20 February 2026, aimed at strengthening participants' understanding of database management and its application in audit.

The programme covered essential concepts of Database Management Systems (DBMS) and Relational Database Management Systems (RDBMS), along with an overview of Oracle Database Server and its various object types. Participants were introduced to Structured Query Language (SQL), including table creation and related database operations, as well as key aspects of database management such as data storage and database administration.

A strong emphasis was placed on practical learning through hands-on sessions, enabling participants to apply SQL queries and database concepts in real-time scenarios. Dedicated practical exercises and doubt-clearing sessions further enhanced their understanding and confidence in handling data effectively.

The sessions were delivered by a combination of internal faculty and external experts, ensuring a blend of theoretical knowledge and practical insights. The programme was well received by the participants and received an overall rating of 9.22 (on a scale of 10).

COLLABORATIVE SEMINAR ON INDIAN ACCOUNTING STANDARD

The Regional Capacity Building and Knowledge Institute organised a Collaborative Seminar on Indian Accounting Standards (Ind-AS) from 12-16 January 2026 in collaboration with the Eastern India Regional Council (EIRC) of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI). The programme brought together participants to enhance their understanding of contemporary accounting standards and their application in audit.

The seminar covered key aspects of the Ind-AS framework, including IFRS convergence in India, the conceptual framework, and presentation of financial statements under Ind-AS, with reference to Ind-AS 1, 8, 10, 16, 23, 115 and 116, along with other relevant standards. Important topics such as accounting for associates, joint ventures, and related parties were also discussed.

The sessions were conducted by Chartered Accountants from ICAI-EIRC along with faculty members from the department, combining professional expertise with practical audit perspectives. Case study discussions, particularly relating to State PSUs, and dedicated doubt-clearing sessions further enhanced participants' understanding of complex accounting issues.

The programme was well received by the participants and received an overall rating of 9.21 (on a scale of 10), reflecting its effectiveness and relevance.
