MCTP LEVEL-2 AND LEVEL-3

The Mid-Career Training Programme (MCTP) commenced in the Department in 2021, targeting Senior Audit Officers and Assistant Audit Officers with the prescribed length of service. Aimed at fostering professionalism, impartiality, and efficiency among departmental officers, the Institute organised MCTP Level-2 from 17 to 21 November 2025 and MCTP Level-3 from 15 to 19 December 2025.

These training programmes were designed to equip participants with essential skills and knowledge, covering areas such as communication with stakeholders, internal control, fraud detection, e-governance attributes, risk management and compliance, team building, stress management, ethics, auditing in an IT environment, and understanding the global environmental crisis.

During the programme, participants of MCTP Level-2 visited the Postal Museum, Kolkata, while those attending MCTP Level-3 visited the East Kolkata Wetlands. Participants actively engaged in all sessions and activities, significantly enriching their overall learning experience. The MCTP Level-2 and Level 3 courses received impressive ratings of 9.55 and 9.04, respectively.

ORIENTATION TRAINING FOR SUPERVISORS AND DRAAOS/DPAOS

The Institute conducted an extensive Orientation Training Programme for user offices from 13 November to 24 December 2025, providing a structured introduction to departmental functioning, key rules and regulations, core audit procedures, and essential skills in noting and drafting. Participants received practical exposure to important IT applications such as OIOS, e-HRMS, e-Office, IDEA, KNIME, and Tableau, along with foundational IT audit techniques, while the curriculum also emphasised personality development and communication skills for effective professional engagement.

The programme covered diverse subjects including organisational culture, tax concepts, advanced MS Excel, Hindi Rajbhasha, CAATs, transparency and governance, problem-solving, delegation of financial powers, constitutional budgeting provisions, the Code of Ethics in the C&AG's office, career progression, and gender sensitisation. Sessions were delivered by faculty from across India, local experts, and internal faculty, and participants demonstrated learning through individual and group presentations as well as a field visit to the Arts Acre Foundation - Museum of Modern Art and Art Centre, Kolkata.

The programme was highly appreciated and received an overall rating of 9.80.

ALL INDIA TRAINING PROGRAMME ON RAILWAY AUDIT

An All-India Training Programme on Railway Audit was conducted from 08 to 12 December 2025 in collaboration with the Centre for Railway Information Systems (CRIS). CRIS is responsible for developing, implementing, and maintaining key information systems for Indian Railways, and plays a vital role in enabling digital transformation, transparency, and efficiency in railway operations and management.

The programme focused on enhancing participants' understanding—drawn from Railway Audit Offices across the country—of railway-specific information systems and their relevance to audit. The sessions included an introduction to Integrated Material Management, followed by detailed discussions on various railway information systems, their modules, and functional applications.

Participants were familiarised with key systems such as the Indian Railways e-Procurement System (IREPS), Freight Operations Information System (FOIS), Integrated Coaching Management System (ICMS), Accounting Information Management System (AIMS), and the Bridge Management System (BMS). The training was further enriched through live demonstrations of these systems, providing practical exposure to their operational and audit dimensions.

The programme received an excellent overall rating of 9.23, reflecting high participant appreciation and the practical value of the training.

TRAINING PROGRAMME ON IT SECURITY WITH CYBER LAW

A three-day training programme on IT Security with Cyber Law was conducted from 14 to 16 October 2025 in collaboration with Maulana Abul Kalam Azad University of Technology (MAKAUT), Kolkata. The programme aimed to strengthen participants' understanding of information security concepts and the legal framework governing cyberspace, with MAKAUT providing valuable academic and practical insights into emerging cyber security challenges.

The sessions covered key areas including IT security fundamentals, the CIA Triad, distinctions between IT security, data security and data privacy, defence-in-depth architecture, cyber-attack typologies, application and network security, data encryption, Government of India IT security policies, and relevant cyber laws, supported by case study discussions. The programme received an overall rating of 8.97, reflecting its relevance and effectiveness in addressing contemporary cyber security and legal concerns.

TRAINING PROGRAMME ON ORACLE DBA AND SQL

A five-day training programme on Oracle DBA and SQL was conducted from 01 to 05 December 2025 with the objective of strengthening participants' understanding of database management and query handling.

The programme covered core areas including DBMS and RDBMS concepts, SQL commands, data manipulation and querying, aggregation using group functions, PL/SQL blocks and variables, and database security, supplemented by hands-on practical sessions to enhance technical proficiency.

The programme covered key aspects of the Companies Act, 2013 and recent amendments, corporate governance framework, Board and AGM procedures, Corporate Social Responsibility, auditing of accounts and supplementary audit, annual financial statements, forensic audit and fraud detection, along with case studies and mock audit exercises.

The programme received an excellent overall rating of 9.60, indicating high participant satisfaction and strong relevance of the training content.

COLLABORATIVE TRAINING ON
CORPORATE GOVERNANCE, COMPLIANCE
AND RISK ASSESSMENT IN AUDIT

A three-day collaborative training programme on Corporate Governance, Compliance, and Risk Assessment in Audit was conducted from 16 to 18 December 2025 in association with the Institute of Company Secretaries of India (ICSI). The programme focused on strengthening auditors' understanding of governance frameworks, compliance mechanisms, and risk-based audit assessment, with a welcome address delivered by the Principal Director, RCB&KI, Kolkata.

Key areas covered included corporate governance structures, SEBI regulations and disclosures, compliance management systems, detection of governance failures and related party transactions, BRSR and CSR audit, corporate law disputes before NCLT/NCLAT, and risk management and internal control systems, supported by case study discussions. The programme received an overall participant rating of 9.20, reflecting its relevance, practical orientation, and effectiveness.
