Annex 2

Salient findings of beneficiaries survey of ORG-MARG Research Limited

- The Consumer survey covered 285 towns, 1223 villages in 140 districts in all states/UT and interviewed 64292 consumers during July 1999 to October, 1999.
- **The key objectives of the survey were to:**
 - Assess extent of reach, availability of commodities, prices and quality of PDS commodities.
 - Estimates consumption needs for essential commodities.
 - Identify key benefits and problems perceived by consumers and areas of improvement, if any.
- **Main findings**
 - Roughly one-third of the sample population was below the poverty line and nearly 45 per cent had an annual income of less than Rs 20000.

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- Extent of awareness about entitlement was low among the consumers.
- Off-take from the PDS was lower than per unit/per card entitlements.
- The quality of commodities available was perceived to be inferior or average.
- The PDS met 12 per cent, 16 per cent, 30 per cent, 61 per cent and 3 per cent of the consumption needs of wheat, rice, sugar and edible oils respectively. In the states of **Madhya Pradesh, Assam, Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir, Nagaland, Manipur, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Chandigarh** and **Bihar**. PDS met only 10 per cent of the consumption needs of rice and wheat.
- Consumption of essential commodities by BPL households was about one third of the total consumption requirements.
- There was lack of mechanism to address grievances with a meagre three per cent ever having lodged a complaint.
- The main problems associated with the PDS as perceived by consumers were unavailability of commodities, stockouts and inconvenience of long queues.
- The key areas of improvement perceived by consumers were:-
 - Commodities should be regularly available (36 per cent).
 - Price should be lower (12 per cent).
 - Among BPL families 28 per cent felt that commodities were not correctly weighed at ration shops.
